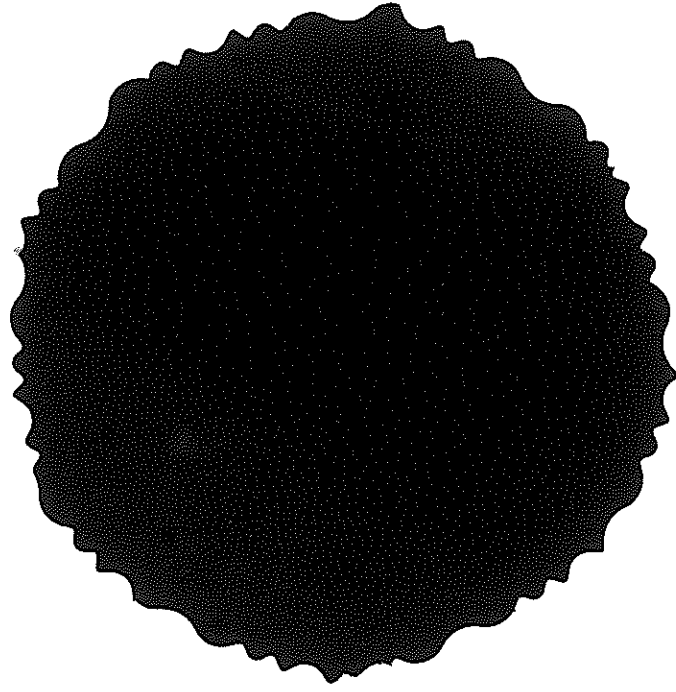

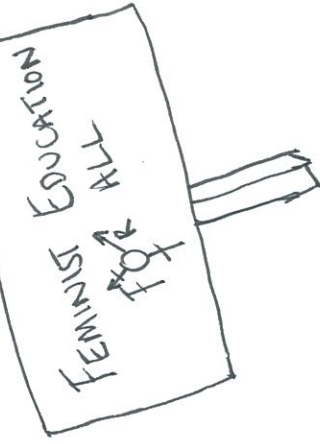

WHO CONVERTED IT INTO THE Web of Science [...] In 2013 the SCI covered 8539 journals, the SSCI 3080 journals, & the A&HCI approx. 1700 journals" (ibid.)

FEAS Cite Club: the zine

Everyday academic sexism is evident throughout university workplaces. One of the sites of sexism is found in common, taken-for-granted citational practices that often excludes diverse voices and scholarship.

The *#FEAS Cite Club*: the zine series was created during workshops into these citational practices at Edith Cowan University in 2019. The zines use humour to irreverently address citational sexism, as well as offer skills and advice on writing, reviewing and publishing.

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
